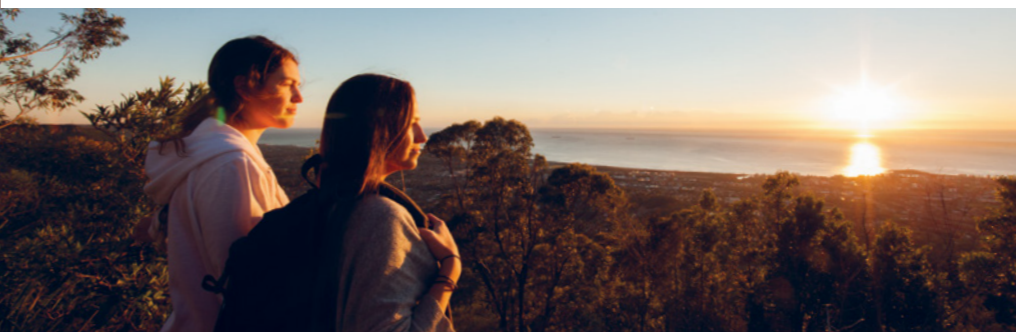

Make yourself at home

Just 90-minutes south of Sydney, Wollongong has the convenience of a big city with the ease of a small town.

GETTING AROUND

Once you arrive, your transport options around Wollongong are safe, easy and affordable.

Free buses

Wollongong is well-connected with buses going to all of the surrounding suburbs. Free 'city loop' buses run all day and into the night, making it easy for you to travel from campus and student accommodation to the city centre, train station and shopping district.

Train

North Wollongong Station is a 15-minute walk or a short free shuttle bus ride from UOW Wollongong.

Bicycle

UOW Wollongong has facilities including showers, change rooms, and secure bike lock-up. Bike racks are also conveniently placed outside buildings across campus.

Walk

Most destinations in the Wollongong CBD are within easy walking distance of each other.

Car

Paid parking on campus is available via the CellOPark app.

Cost

For any public transport in and between Wollongong and Sydney, you'll never pay more than \$18.70 a day or \$50 a week.¹

There are more than 3,000 businesses in Wollongong CBD with new cafes and shops opening up all the time. You can also join one of many special interest Meet Up groups going on around the region.

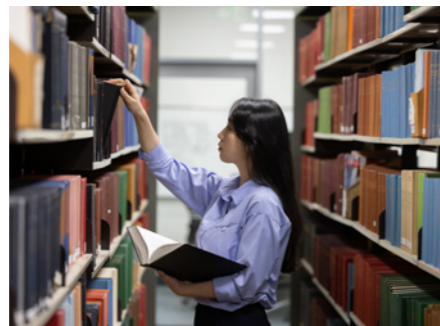
Innovation Campus

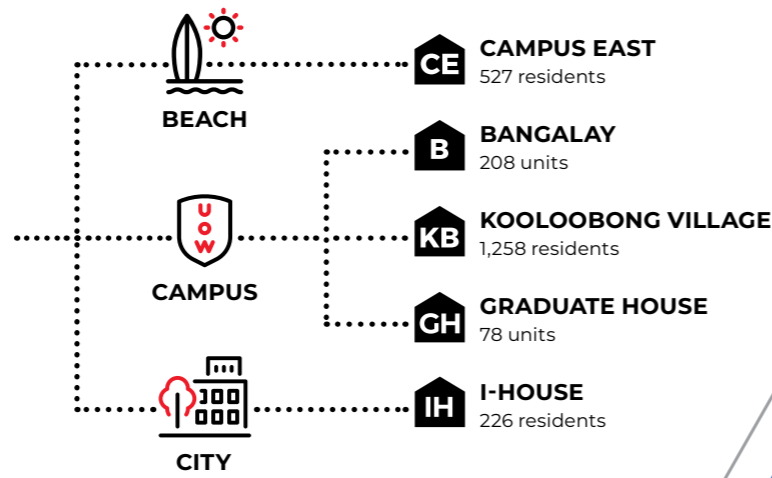

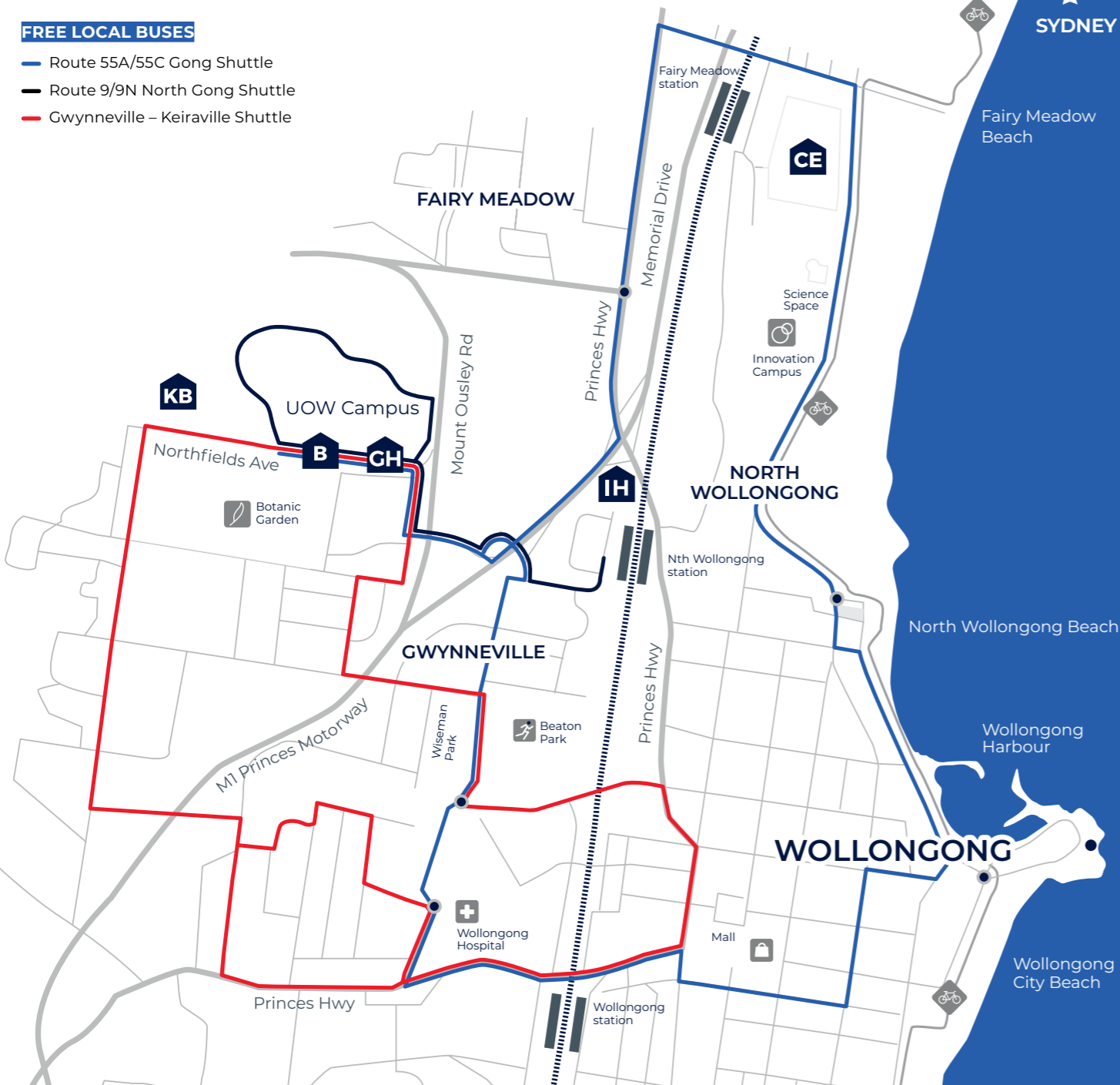

ACADEMIC ADVISERS AND POSTGRADUATE COORDINATORS

RELIGIOUS SERVICES

There are a range of religious services on-and-off campus, including a Muslim prayer space, the Omar Mosque near UOW Wollongong campus, the Nan Tien Buddhist Temple in nearby Berkeley and the Sri Venkateswara Hindu temple in Helensburgh. Student-based religious clubs include the Uni Bible Group, UOW International Christian Group (ICG) and the Muslim Association of Wollongong University.

STUDENT SUPPORT ADVISERS

These advisers provide support and referral services to UOW students. They also provide programs supporting student equity and diversity both within faculties and across campus. Advisers can assist you with a range of issues such as settling into the local area, study difficulties, academic concerns, budgeting, homesickness and legal issues. They can also advise on student visas, health and personal problems, family emergencies, and children's education. The service is free and confidential.

UOW SECURITY SERVICE

UOW Security helps provide a safe and secure campus environment. Trained and licensed security officers deliver emergency response, first aid, after-dark escorts and patrols 24-hours a day, seven days a week.

Metropolitan campuses



Liverpool campus

UOW's metropolitan campus in Liverpool offers undergraduate and postgraduate degrees. The campus provides an experience that is specially designed to meet the needs of our students.

PERSONALISED STUDY

As a UOW Liverpool student you'll benefit from smaller class sizes and individual attention from your teachers who are leaders in their respective fields of study. This is a great opportunity to meet industry leaders and learn from the best.

TRANSPORT

Campus is only a four-minute walk from Liverpool railway station. The city boasts one of Sydney's first rapid bus T-way (transit way) systems, connecting you to other major areas around Sydney. The free community shuttle also stops just outside campus and is a great way to move around the CBD.

FACILITIES

UOW Liverpool is a vibrant and growing campus providing everything you need to make the most of your degree, including computer labs, nursing labs, student kitchens, a recreation space, an outdoor rooftop terrace, dedicated quiet study areas and a prayer room. All of this is located within walking distance to public transport and Liverpool's shopping district.

ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT

A short train ride will lead you to Casula Powerhouse Arts Centre, a multi-disciplinary space showcasing art, live performance and music. If that's not your style, try a local karaoke bar, comic book hotspot, The Comic Shop, or the Liverpool City Library.

FOOD

You don't need to go far to satisfy your appetite between lectures or tutorials with a variety of food outlets on almost every street. Spice up your lunch break with an Indian curry, grab some treats from an Afghani bakery or order some pizza or Thai food. If you prefer to bring your lunch, make the most of UOW's kitchen facilities on campus.

Study globally

UOW has campuses in Dubai, India, Hong Kong and Malaysia, and a presence in China and Singapore.

Our global network provides students with opportunities to access quality education delivered by UOW outside of Australia.

INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION PARTNERS

UOW has established partnerships with a number of international education institutions to provide students with opportunities to access quality education outside Australia.

These include:

- Central China Normal University (CCNU) UOW Joint Institute
- UOW Malaysia

TWINNING ARRANGEMENTS

UOW has twinning arrangements with Beijing Jiaotong University, Zhengzhou University and Tiangong University that are formally recognised by the Chinese Ministry of Education. Students are able to complete part of their program at their home institution and then transfer to UOW to complete the remainder of their degree.

Offshore transfer discount

We encourage our students to take a truly global approach to their education and have established pathways between our international and Australian campuses. Students of UOW Dubai, UOW College Hong Kong, and UOW Malaysia who wish to transfer may be eligible for a **30 per cent tuition fee reduction** for the subjects they complete onshore in Australia.

COUNTRY-SPECIFIC ACADEMIC ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

UOW and UOW College Australia recognise secondary qualifications from more than 40 countries and education systems from all around the world, including GCE A Levels, International Baccalaureate and SAT. UOW College Australia can assess students who have completed the equivalent of Australian high school (Year 12) from places such as: China, India, Nepal, Vietnam, and more. Students who have completed an approved Foundation Studies or equivalent program may also be considered for direct entry to UOW.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

All students are required to meet the English language entry requirements specified for their course and provide evidence of their English language proficiency.

Results in the major international English language tests are accepted, including IELTS, TOEFL, Pearson, and Cambridge. Tests are required to be taken within two years of course commencement for English language courses.

PREVIOUS STUDY IN ENGLISH

Applicants may meet the English language requirement based on successful studies in Australia or offshore where English is the language of instruction. With the exception of the HLT54121 Diploma of Nursing, please refer to specific English language requirements on page 31.

STUDY IN AUSTRALIA OR AUSTRALIAN QUALIFICATIONS OFFSHORE

Successful completion of the following qualifications are acceptable as meeting the University's English language requirement:

- Year 12 in Australia, or any Australian Year 12 qualification completed offshore;
- Foundation Studies, Certificate IV or Diploma with a minimum duration of one year (full-time) completed in Australia; or any of these qualifications completed at an Australian institution offshore;
- At least one year of full-time study toward a bachelor's or master's degree in Australia, or at an Australian institution offshore.

OTHER QUALIFICATIONS COMPLETED IN ENGLISH

Applicants may be considered as meeting the English language requirements if they have successfully completed two (2) years of secondary or tertiary study at an approved institution where:

- the language of instruction was English; and
- the institution is located in a country where the official language is English.

Academic transcripts and an official letter from the institution certifying that English was the sole language of instruction and assessment must be provided. Previous study in English is considered on a case-by-case basis and does not automatically meet UOW's English language requirement.

WHAT IS THE ENGLISH REQUIREMENT FOR MY COURSE?

The English requirement for each course is shown in the preceding course description pages. The requirements are shown in terms of the IELTS academic test requirements. For example, the English requirement for the Bachelor of Commerce is IELTS: 6.0 (R:6, W:6, L:5, S:5).

This means, to meet the English requirement for this course, a minimum overall score of IELTS 6.0 is required, with at least 6.0 in reading and writing, and 5.0 in speaking and listening bands.

The equivalent scores for overall and individual band scores in the TOEFL and Pearson Test of English (academic tests) can be determined by using the table below:

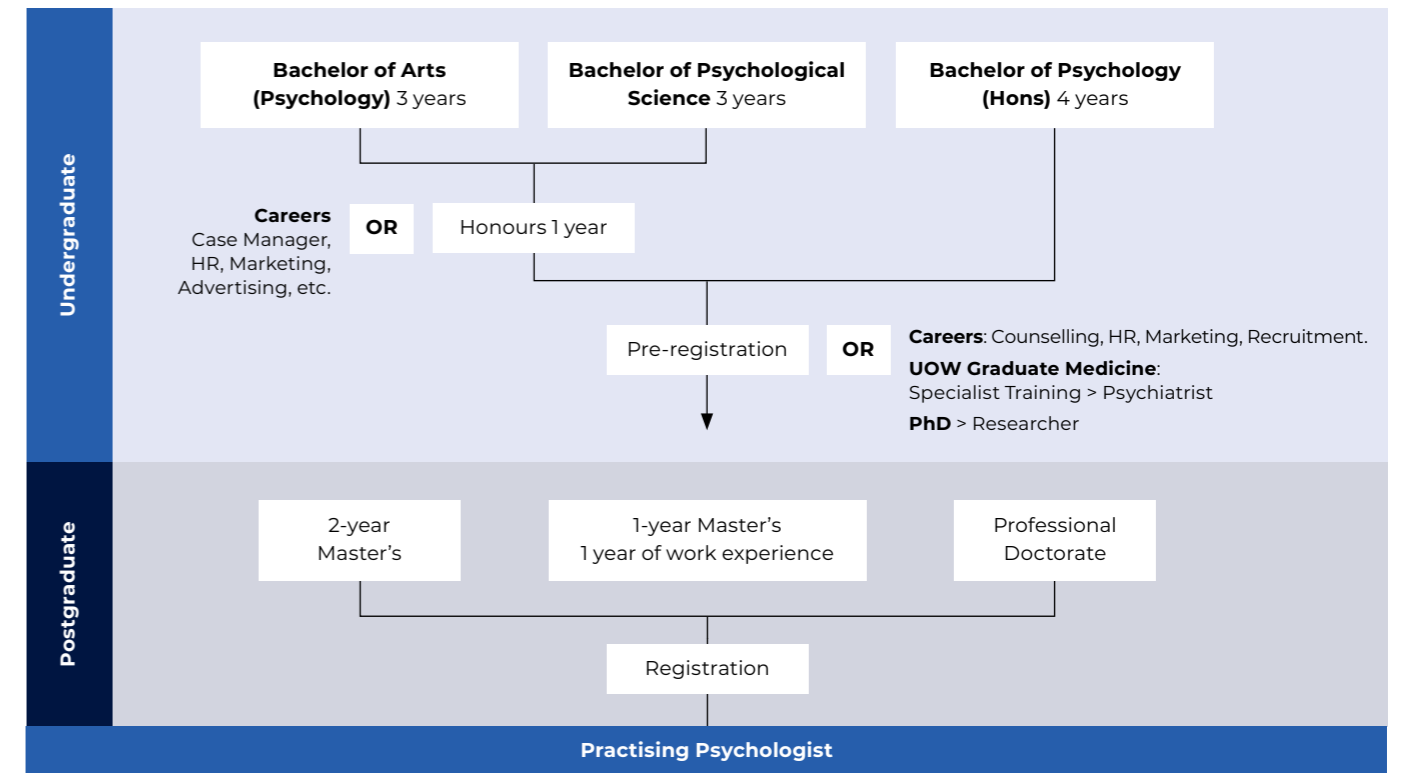

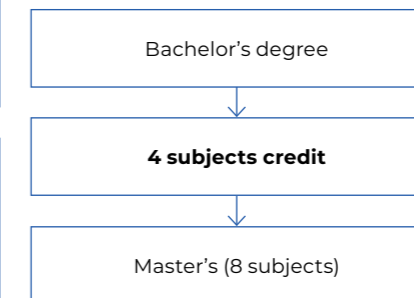

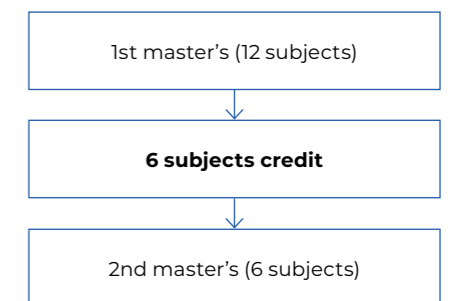

International applicants from certain citizenships who are required to undergo Genuine Student Assessment will need to apply through an agent, you can find a UOW authorised agent at: uow.info/agent-list

If your citizenship doesn't need to undergo Genuine Student Assessment, you can choose to apply through an agent or apply directly through our Apply Online portal.

If you are currently studying an Australian Year 12 qualification, New Zealand NCEA level 3, or International Baccalaureate Diploma (IBPD), you may choose to apply through the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC).

If you are interested in applying for Higher Degree Research (HDR) courses such as Research Masters or Doctor of Philosophy (PhD), you are encouraged to find a supervisor first, prepare your research proposal, then apply for admission. The steps for applying through our online portal are mapped below.

Step 1

Submit an online application on our Apply Online portal

To set up your applicant profile, we will ask you to provide us with some personal information and your course preference. We recommend you look up your preferred course information on CourseFinder before starting an application.

Step 2

Prepare documents to support your application

As part of the application process, we may request supporting documentation such as your passport, completion certificate and transcripts for verifying your academic background, English proficiency test results, and subject description or syllabus if applying for Credit for Prior Learning (CPL).

Step 3

Submit application and receive a letter of acknowledgement

Once you have successfully submitted an application, you will receive a letter of acknowledgement.

Step 4

Receive an Offer of Admissions and clear offer conditions to validate your offer

If your application is successful, you will receive an Offer of Admission. Your offer may have conditions that you need to meet before you can validate your conditional offer into a full offer for acceptance.

Step 5

Pay deposit to secure your offer and exchange for Confirmation of Enrolment (COE)

You must submit the Fee Payable stated on your offer before a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) is issued to you for your student visa application.

Step 6

Apply for your student visa and plan your travel

All international students require a valid visa to study onshore in Australia which must be obtained before travelling to Australia.

Previous study in English[^]

Applicants may meet the English language requirement based on successful study in English in Australia, or offshore. Previous study in English is considered on a case-by-case basis and does not automatically meet UOW's English language requirement.

Previous qualifications must have been completed within two years of commencement at UOW.

STUDY IN AUSTRALIA OR AUSTRALIAN QUALIFICATIONS OFFSHORE

Successful completion of one of the following qualifications are accepted as meeting the University's English language requirement:

- Year 12 in Australia, or any Australian Year 12 qualification completed offshore;
- Foundation Studies, Certificate IV or Diploma with a minimum duration of one year (full-time) completed in Australia; or any of these qualifications completed at an Australian institution offshore;*
- At least one year of full-time study toward a bachelor's or master's degree in Australia, or at an Australian institution offshore.*

OTHER QUALIFICATIONS COMPLETED IN ENGLISH

Applicants may be considered as meeting the English language requirements if they have successfully completed two years of secondary or tertiary study at an approved institution where:

- the language of instruction was English; and
- the institution is located in the Bahamas, Barbados, Canada, Fiji, Ireland, Jamaica, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Singapore, Solomon Islands, South Africa, Tonga, Trinidad & Tobago, UK or USA.

Academic transcripts and an official letter from the institution certifying that English was the sole language of instruction and assessment must be provided.

Visa requirements

As an international student you may have to meet the English language requirements based on your citizenship for visa purposes, as advised by the Department of Home Affairs. Please refer to homeaffairs.gov.au for more details.

UOW COUNTRY SCHOLARSHIPS

The country-specific scholarships support our international students to study here in Australia by making world-class education more affordable. UOW has extended this offering to more diverse countries and regions that are not eligible for any other scholarship or discount. Students who receive an offer to study an eligible UOW course in 2025 from these specific regions will automatically have the 20 per cent discount applied for the minimum duration of an eligible course.

Eligibility:

Required to be an International citizen of Brazil, Chile, China, Columbia, Ethiopia, Ghana, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Kenya, Malaysia, Mexico, Peru, Philippines, Singapore, South Africa, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Thailand, Turkey, Vietnam, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

Exclusions:

UOW country bursaries are not available for students studying a Doctor of Medicine, Nutrition and Dietetics, Exercise Physiology, Teaching, Social Work and Psychology degrees or in conjunction with any other scholarship or discount.

Postgraduate coursework scholarships

UOW POSTGRADUATE ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

If you are commencing your coursework postgraduate degree at UOW, you may be eligible for a 30 per cent tuition fee waiver.

Eligibility:

Qualify as an international student. Must choose an eligible masters' (coursework) degree at UOW (Australian campuses only).

Exclusions:

This scholarship is not available for students studying a Doctor of Medicine, Nutrition and Dietetics, Exercise Physiology, Teaching, Social Work and Psychology degrees. You may not be in receipt of any other scholarship, sponsorship, bursary or discount, and may not receive credit for prior learning.

UOW ALUMNI POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

If you have previously completed a UOW degree, you may be eligible for a 10 per cent tuition fee waiver.

Eligibility:

You must have completed a UOW bachelor's degree, be commencing a full-fee paying postgraduate coursework degree, and must maintain a credit average (65+) throughout your course.

Research scholarships

UOW offers a wide range of research scholarships which may be awarded to eligible International Higher Degree Research (HDR) students.

UOW HDR scholarships are in the form of allowances to assist candidates in meeting their living costs while they undertake their research. These can include Annual Stipends, Living Allowances and Tuition Fee Costs. The main UOW scholarship schemes are the University Postgraduate Awards (UPA), Australian Government Research Training Program (AGRTP) Scholarship and the International Postgraduate Tuition Awards (IPTA).

Applications for Session 1, 2026 close Friday, 3 October 2025. There are also scholarships offered by individual faculties or research centres.
