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The Queensland education system

The Queensland Government school system for international students starts at Prep (6+ years of age).

Students complete seven years of primary school (Prep to Year 6) and six years of high school (Years 7 to 12).

Students can finish high school at Year 10 if they wish to pursue vocational training or employment.

Senior high school comprises the final 2 years, Years 11 and 12. The completion of Year 12 can then lead to university studies.

School hours

School hours are usually Monday to Friday from 9am to 3pm, but can vary slightly from school to school. Attendance at school is compulsory except in special circumstances, such as illness. Schools keep records of attendance which are reported back to EQI.

Assessment

Schools have processes in place for continuous assessment of students' academic progress throughout the year. Assessment tasks contribute to final grades and may include:

- assignments
- written and/or practical examinations
- oral presentations.

Fees

There are tuition fees associated with all of our EQI study programs. The pricing varies depending on which program you choose and for how long.

The fees cover all curriculum schooling and teaching costs as well as curriculum-related excursions.

Some non-tuition fees may also apply for items such as school uniforms and non-curriculum activities and these costs differ from school to school.



Primary School

CRICOS Course Code: 082519A

Our Primary School program gives young students a positive start to their early development and learning.

All students from a non-English speaking background receive specialist English as an Additional Language/Dialect (EAL/D) lessons so they can fully participate in classroom and extracurricular activities.

Primary school provides a strong foundation for future study.

International Primary School students must hold a Student Visa, (Subclass 500)* to start an EQI International Student Program.

International students enrolled in primary school must stay with a parent or Department of Home Affairs approved relative.

To be eligible for the Student Visa, (Subclass 500) international students must be 6 years of age or older.

HSP High School Preparation

CRICOS Course Code: 078785F

EQI's High School Preparation (HSP) program is an intensive English language program that prepares students for mainstream high school studies.

Students build their English language fluency in different contexts such as mathematics, science, literature and humanities and social studies (HASS), so they can understand the language used in the mainstream curriculum.

The HSP program features:

- 10-week modules
- minimum 20 hours of instruction per week
- three different levels (elementary, pre-intermediate and intermediate)
- range of learning methods including text books, videos, group discussions and practical activities
- opportunities to make friends through learning activities, excursions and sports.

HS High School

The High School program is designed for students seeking to graduate high school in Queensland and qualify for tertiary study in Australia or abroad.

Students can choose from over 70 schools throughout Queensland that offer a diverse range of academic, creative and sports programs.

Students who complete Years 11 and 12 receive the internationally recognised Queensland Certificate of Education and may be eligible for university study.

*Students under the age of 6 can enrol in the primary program but they will not be able to hold their own student visa until they turn 6. Prior to that they must be enrolled as a dependant on their parent's guardian visa.

Please note: Prep is the first year of schooling in Queensland and local children must be 5 years by 30 June in the year of enrolment.

HS High School (Study Abroad)

The Study Abroad program is a high school experience providing opportunities to pursue personal, cultural and academic goals.

Experience the full Aussie lifestyle with a shorter commitment from 1, 3, 6, 9 or 12 months. The program is an ideal opportunity to live in a different part of the world to study what interests you and trying new subjects while practising English.

Schools are located all over Queensland, including options in regional areas that provide a unique lifestyle experience. Course fees may vary depending on the location and school you choose.

Students are welcomed into the school community, improve their English proficiency and learn about Australian culture, before returning home to continue their studies. Study Abroad in Queensland is recognised by several education systems abroad.*

IB

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB) is an internationally recognised qualification for high achievers who are ready to commit two years in Year 11 and 12 for an outstanding global qualification in preparation for university. The IB curriculum aims to develop your thinking, communication, self-management, teamwork and research skills to be one-step ahead for preparation to university.

The IB is one of the world's most innovative educational courses offered for 16 to 18-year olds and is globally recognised by universities for the holistic and rigorous education it provides.

The IB fulfils many national and state education system requirements and lets you transfer from a Queensland IB school to any other IB school in the world.

Did you know the IB also works in reverse? If you are studying an IB in your home country, you could spend 6 months or a year here in Queensland, experiencing an Aussie lifestyle and then return to your home country school and receive the full IB qualification after graduating.

Students wishing to enrol in the IB program should have achieved high academic results in a range of subjects prior to application.

Queensland Academies International Baccalaureate

The IB is also offered as a 3-year program for Years 10, 11 and 12 at the 3 selective Queensland Academies (QA) and unlike our other Queensland Government schools, IB is the only program they deliver to international students.

- Queensland Academies Creative Industries Campus (QACI)
- Queensland Academies Health Sciences Campus (QAHS)
- Queensland Academy for Science Mathematics and Technology (QASMT)

Students commence at the Academies at the beginning of Year 10 for an immersion IB preparation program.

The IB curriculum aims to develop your thinking, communication, self-management, teamwork and research skills to be one-step ahead for preparation to university.

It is one of the world's most innovative educational courses offered for 16 to 18-year olds and is globally recognised by universities for the holistic and rigorous education it provides.

Partnerships with leading universities provide many benefits including credits toward second-year university courses, achieving additional tertiary rankings, industry experience and access to world-class resources and facilities.

EQI's Holiday Adventure Programs are a fantastic way to make the most of your school holidays!


Discover historic landmarks and visit famous Aussie icons as you create friendships and memories to last a lifetime.

Support at school

Queensland Government schools understand the needs of international students and have a specialist support team at each school.

International Student Coordinator: provides academic and pastoral guidance to international students.

Homestay Coordinator: organises placement and ensures students have an enjoyable homestay experience.

Guidance Officer: provides specialist counselling and advice on academic pathways, career options and personal wellbeing.



Arriving and getting settled

When you first arrive in Queensland, you will be met at the airport by a representative arranged by your host school. Contact your school coordinator to make arrangements for your arrival in Queensland.

You and your family will be provided with information about your Queensland school including details of school facilities and any school policies that you need to know.

Accommodation options

Accommodation options vary according to your age and level of schooling.

- Students enrolled in the Primary School program must live with a parent or close relative* as defined by the Australian Immigration Regulations.
- High school students can choose to live with an EQI approved homestay provider, a parent or legal guardian*.
- EQI does not permit independent living even if the student is 18 years of age or older.

* A parent, close relative or legal guardian is responsible for obtaining the necessary visa to stay in Australia, as required by Australian immigration regulations.

24-hour care

Further peace of mind is knowing you have a freecall 1800 QSTUDY (1800 778 839) support phone service in Queensland, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. This number can also be phoned from overseas, remembering to dial the +61 first.

All international students have access to 24-hour emergency assistance and multilingual support.

1800 QSTUDY (1800 778 839) is an after-hours service available before 9 am and after 3 pm on school days, and 24-hours a day during weekends, public holidays and school vacations.

Brisbane




Gold Coast

Queensland Government schools provide an excellent standard of education that leads to flexible academic and career pathways.

Completion of Year 11 and 12 provides an internationally recognised high school qualification – the Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).

This qualification gives international students access to a wide range of options for further study and training toward the career of their choice.

On completion of Year 12, eligible students receive an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) which determines eligibility for university study.

Our schools offer a diverse range of subjects designed to nurture every students potential, whether their interest is science, technology, business, languages, the arts or other areas.

Extracurricular activities are also encouraged to support physical health and social wellbeing.

Ready to apply? Here's what you need to do

Program entry requirements

Academic requirements

Students must meet the entry requirements to enrol in a course or program, and must provide current and accurate information to support their application, including: the minimum level of English language proficiency, and evidence of their academic qualifications.

You can find the entry requirements for each EQI education program at eqi.com.au/apply-now/policies-and-procedures

Note:

- Experienced staff will place each student in a year level which is comparable to the level of education they have already achieved.
- Students must achieve at least a pass or better in their core subjects in their own country.*

*There may be subject prerequisites that apply to placement in certain subjects, particularly at senior high school level.

English language requirements

Students must provide evidence that they meet one of the following criteria:

- All subjects have been conducted in English for a minimum of two years at the relevant school level.
- Students have achieved a satisfactory result in an approved English language test (for example IELTS, ISLPR and Eiken).
- Students have successfully completed an approved intensive English course (for example the HSP program offered by EQI).



Visa requirements

Students and relatives or legal guardians will need an appropriate visa. Please visit the Australian Department of Home Affairs https://immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-avisa/visa-finder

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

The Australian Government requires that international students in Australia maintain medical cover through an approved OSHC provider or fall in one of the exemption categories https:// immi.homeaffairs.gov.au/visas/getting-a-visa/visa-listing/ student-500

EQI can arrange OSHC on your behalf through Allianz Care, the EQI preferred provider of OSHC.
